Marysville Fire Chief Ned Vander Pol

He came to Marysville last year from Vista, California. He's a retired fire chief from down there and has years and years of experience. He joined the fire service in 1995 as a volunteer firefighter in California. He then served two decades with the Vista Fire Department in San Diego County, working through the ranks before retiring as Vista's Fire Chief in December 2022. Chief Vander Pol gave a very interesting report on the history of the Fire Service and a short update on the Marysville Fire District.

To put in a sign, you have to put landscaping in Peter recommends putting some stuff in there that is low maintenance, hopefully drought-resistant, and easy to deal with. So, there's a lot more stuff than just getting a sign. We are considering about \$6,000 for the whole project, which is considerable. It's lower than the bid we got last year, and we've had some gifts from members that are specifically to go to the sign. - **Roadside sign:** Peter met with the sign gentleman last Thursday. The city's planning department has pushed back on our permit because our sign is too close to the road. And if we are to be as far back from close to the road as they say it needs to be, it will be in the parking lot. Our options would be to make the sign smaller or to apply for a variance in which we can prove that there will be undue harm to MHS. If we do not put the sign closer to the road, Peter instructed the sign gentleman to attempt to file the variance because it would cost us too much money to tear up the parking lot to move the sign away from the street. Put in the sign. It cost a lot of money, so Peter adjusted the sign's layout to be as close to the back of the planter box as possible. So, before the point of the sign, it was on the sidewalk. So now the back legs are at the curb. So that This will put it back about an additional two feet. However, we're nowhere near the six feet they require. If these changes don't that doesn't work, MHS must return to the drawing board.

50th Anniversary Party: The party was very successful. We had 125 guests. MHS raised about \$11,000. The mayor did read a proclamation. The Marysville City Council MHS was honoring our 50th anniversary at the city council meeting a few weeks ago.

Peter has already started working on supplying some of the names of Marysville's Founders, who were Civil War veterans. Then, the Civil War Seattle will research our founders, find out information on them, and then do a presentation for us.

President Peter Condyles called the special board meeting of the Marysville Historical Society to order at 5:30 p.m.

Museum Sign Update

President Condyles invited Mr. Jonathan Sullivan from Ruckus Design Company to give an update and answer questions regarding the museum sign updates. Mr. Sullivan reported that the City of Marysville will require the treated posts holding the sign to be covered with plywood and decorative faux rock sheeting. Mr. Sullivan reported the sign should last about 40 years before needing replacement or updates. Trustee Donohue wondered if aluminum posts would be a better and longer lasting solution rather than treated posts. Mr. Sullivan responded that aluminum posts could be used. Mr. Sullivan went on to report that with the addition of marine plywood and the faux stone façade around the base of the sign along with landscaping junipers, the additional cost to the MHS would be about \$3,800 above the original sign bid. Mr. Sullivan is willing to allow MHS to pay any final amount above the original sign bid in two months' time. After much discussion, it was decided that volunteers from MHS will do the landscaping around the sign, thus reducing the cost of the overage, and that aluminum posts to hold the sign is preferred. Mr. Sullivan will also provide two different mockups with two different colors of faux rock sheeting. Mr. Sullivan stated that it will take Ruckus Design two months to manufacture the new sign with two days needed to install it by the street.

Motion by Jodi Hiatt, seconded by Linda Molitor to approve the additions to the museum sign and proceed with the build/installation as follows:

- 1. Vote on the use aluminum poles to hold the sign or vote on treated poles.**
- 2. MHS volunteers will install the required landscaping.**
- 3. Vote on two different mockups provided ahead of sign installation to choose the color of the decorative faux stone base.**

Motion passed unanimously.

Jennifer Stapleton, the new Marysville city administrator from Sandpoint, Idaho, and I introduced myself and gave a short presentation on her background. Jennifer was a city administrator for eight years while at Sandpoint. Jennifer was also Sandpoint's first city administrator, and one of the many accomplishments she is proud of is that she assisted the city in creating our first arts, culture, and historic preservation master plan. Before Sandpoint, Jennifer was in Spokane, Washington, and moved there from growing up in Helena, Montana. Jennifer moved to Spokane, Washington, to attend University and Eastern Washington University and then went into working in the nonprofit and government worlds from there. Jennifer, I worked for both Spokane County and the city of Silcan. I was the executive director of a non-profit in the community for 14 years, coming out of my master's program.

Hopefully, by the end of October, we'll be able to put the sign up there. So maybe by our next general meeting, we'll have a sign out there.

- b. **Cemetery Tour:** Thank you to everyone who attended last month's cemetery tour. Thank you to Tom, Dennis, and Steve for their work on the presentations. We had about 60 attendees.
- c. **Gehl House:** Gehl House is closed for the season. The turnout was fantastic. Thanks to Kevin for covering Saturdays. And the new roof looks great. If you haven't had a chance to look over there, the roof. It just looks fantastic.
- d. **Church Bell:** Thanks to Tom, John Hiatt, Steve Edin, and Kevin for finishing the bell. The original Church installed the bell in 1930. Then, in 2003, when the Baptist Church celebrated its 100th anniversary. It was the first missionary who went out from the first Baptist church, what it was downtown, and stayed. The first missionary rang the Bell when she left to be a missionary. A, and she went out to be a missionary. The first missionary returned for the 100th anniversary and rang the belly again for the church.
- e. **Totem Pole:** Ron Loop came out a few weeks ago to look over the totem pole. Sent. It's already rained this fall—late summer. - c. **Film/Tape Digitization:** A few weeks ago, Peter sent us more Strawberry Festival tapes and films to be digitized. Well, film. I've sent those. They have been sent back, and they're still in Tennessee and getting digitized. We should have them in the next few weeks. Daniel, our Sunday volunteer, has figured out how to digitize VHS tapes. Thank you to Tom and the Strawberry Festival for finding the footage and allowing us to digitize it. MHS has digitized what I sent back from 1950 through 1956. then we did 1957, which had already been digitized, which was the year. We already had digitized. And then, there were Six little reels, probably about that big. They were about that big that was unlabeled.
- d. **Nominating committee:** Peter appointed Steve Edin, chair of the nominating committee, once again, for this year's board members. This year's terms include our Linda, Steve Muller, and Morri. Marysville Fire Chief Ned Vander Pol

He came to Marysville last year from Vista, California. He's a retired fire chief from down there and has years and years of experience. He joined the fire service in 1995 as a volunteer firefighter in California. He then served two decades with the Vista Fire Department in San Diego County, working through the ranks before retiring as Vista's Fire Chief in December 2022. Chief Vander Pol gave a very interesting report on the history of the Fire Service and a short update on the Marysville Fire District.
